In addition to the dozen outreach ministry offerings and activities listed in the previous message specifically for the love of children, here’s what is also listed for the love of neighbor: One Great Hour of Sharing, Neighbors In Need, Strengthen the Church, Veterans of the Cross, Hartman Center Love Offering, Special Offering for Incarnation UCC flood support, Church World Service clean-up buckets, Blanket Month, Silver Express Food Bank, Garden Produce Program, Community Garden Plots, UCC Elves, Pet Blessing, showed movie” Risen”, Book Study, hosted Wayne Band concert, hosted WCFC Thanksgiving service, and Pollinator & Wildlife Habitat.

Our Annual Report indicates that we love our neighbors in a multitude of ways! Also revealed in the report is that we provide and maintain a comfortable and attractive building and grounds with a dedicated and talented pastor, staff and membership so that we are able to show our neighbors that we love them unconditionally when they read **“No matter where you are on life’s journey you are welcome here.”**
